	<p><b>Korea. A Cold War Conflict 1950-1953</b> – Published 2016</p> <p>This publication is a learning resource designed for teachers of the Year 10 Australian Curriculum: Humanities and Social Sciences: History, to explore Australia’s involvement in the Korean War. Using primary and secondary sources, students investigate the experiences of those who served in the Korean War, and the impact of the war on Korea and Koreans. Following an introduction to Australia’s involvement in the Korean War and two concept – clarification activities, students and teachers can work through investigations that develop knowledge, understanding and an empathetic appreciation of a variety of Australian experiences of the war in combat and on the home front.</p>
	<p><b>Resource: Stories of Australian innovation in wartime</b> – Published August 2016</p> <p>The fourth title in the Century of Service series, <i>Resource</i>, is aimed at an upper primary and secondary audience. Readers can learn about how camouflage has evolved, the invention of periscope and drip rifles, the creation of dummies and decoys and how Australians staged escapes and rescues during wartime. A glossary of terms used in the text is provided. Copies are available for sale from the Australian War Memorial.</p>
	<p><b>Here they come: A day to remember (Lower Primary)</b> – Published January 2016</p> <p>This education publication and associated learning activities have been developed for lower primary students to assist in developing students’ understanding of commemoration. It explores a variety of characters and their perspectives on Anzac Day. Balancing fictional characters, stylised illustrations and photographs, the publication shows students that Anzac Day is significant to many Australians, is an important part of Australian community life, and is a respectful event containing commemorative traditions and symbols. The learning activities align to the Australian Curriculum: Humanities and Social Sciences.</p>
	<p><b>Chinese Anzacs</b> – Published October 2015</p> <p>With the Anzac Centenary there has been renewed interest in understanding the experiences of Australia’s diverse cultural groups during the First World War. The stories in this publication focus on individual wartime experiences, the challenges of being an Australian soldier of Chinese ancestry and their return to civilian life.</p>
	<p><b>Ancestry: Stories of multicultural Anzacs</b> – Published March 2015</p> <p>This education publication is the third book in the <i>Century of Service</i> series and is aimed at upper primary and lower secondary schools students. It explores stories of individuals and families from different cultural backgrounds who served Australia in the First World War. The stories contain educational questions, historical facts and did you know questions. A glossary of terms used in the text is provided. Copies are available for sale from the Australian War Memorial.</p>
	<p><b>We Remember Anzac (Primary)</b> – Published October 2014</p> <p>This education publication provides an Order of Service and step-by-step instructions to assist teachers and community groups to organise a respectful commemorative event and is accompanied by a CD containing the Last Post, Rouse and National Anthems. The resource includes inquiry-based learning activities which encourage a greater understanding and awareness of the Anzac story, symbols of commemoration, significance of memorials and the enduring impact of the First World War on Australian society.</p>


	<p><b>We Remember Anzac (Secondary)</b> – Published October 2014</p> <p>This education publication provides an Order of Service and step-by-step instructions to assist teachers and community groups to organise a respectful commemorative event and is accompanied by a CD containing the Last Post, Rouse and National Anthems. The resource includes inquiry-based learning activities which encourage a greater understanding and awareness of the Anzac story, the significance of commemoration, and the enduring impact of the First World War on Australian society.</p>
	<p><b>Schooling, Service and the Great War (Primary)</b> – Published October 2014</p> <p>This education resource explores the experiences of Australian school communities during the Great War. Each of the investigations uses historical sources to look at what schools were like during the Great War, what students learned about the British Empire, the patriotic activities that many students performed and how families and school communities coped with sadness and loss.</p>
	<p><b>Audacity – Stories of heroic Australians in wartime</b> – Published March 2014</p> <p>This education publication is the second book in the <i>Century of Service</i> series and is aimed at upper primary and lower secondary schools students. It explores some of the extraordinary stories of bravery and courage of men and women in Australian wartime history. The stories contain educational questions, historical facts and did you know questions. A glossary of terms used in the text is provided. Copies are available for sale from the Australian War Memorial.</p>
	<p><b>Schooling, Service and the Great War (Secondary)</b> - Published March 2014</p> <p>This education resource investigates the diverse experiences of Australian school communities during the Great War. Each investigation uses primary and secondary sources to look at what students were learning about the British Empire, its Allies and enemies, the consequences on daily life at school, the values taught, the patriotic activities undertaken, the reasons why some students and teachers enlisted and responses to the loss or wounding of people from school communities. Each investigation has 'tuning in' and 'going further' learning activities. Additional sources are provided on a CD-ROM.</p>
	<p><b>Devotion: Stories of Australia's wartime nurses</b> – Published March 2013</p> <p>This education resource is the first book in the <i>Century of Service</i> series and is aimed at primary and lower secondary schools students. It explores the contribution and courage of Australian nurses in conflicts and peacekeeping operations from the Boer War to the present.</p>
	<p><b>Indigenous Service</b> – Published March 2013</p> <p>This education resource has been developed for primary and secondary schools in collaboration with the Shrine of Remembrance. These resources acknowledge the service and sacrifice of Indigenous men and women from the First World War to the present and provide a social and political context of their service in the light of past racial discrimination.</p>
	<p><b>Kokoda</b> – Published March 2012</p> <p>This resource has been developed to mark the 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the battles along the Kokoda Track. The book contains 12 units of teaching and learning activities for secondary school students. Through this publication, students can learn about the significance and strategic importance of Kokoda, the people involved in the war, the fighting and living conditions, casualties, the personal experiences of Australian and Japanese soldiers, General Blamey's 'Rabbit Speech' and modern day commemorations and pilgrimages to the site. The publication includes a DVD, CD and posters providing additional background information and learning activities.</p>

	<p><b>Forever Yours</b> – Published March 2011</p> <p>This publication is designed for upper primary and secondary students. The book is a collection of stories about love in wartime using mementos, letters and photographs which explore the notions of love and friendship during wartime. The stories complement the teaching activities found in the Teachers' Guidebook: <i>We'll meet again</i> for secondary students.</p>
	<p><b>We'll Meet Again</b> – Published March 2011</p> <p>This education resource provides teachers and students with learning activities and information on love and friendship experienced during times of conflict. This teachers' guidebook provides classroom ready activities which encourage senior students to analyse and develop historical literacy skills through inquiry learning on the theme of relationships forged, lost or found in wartime. The learning activities link to the Australian English and History Curriculum.</p>
	<p><b>Gallipoli and the Anzacs</b> - Published March 2010</p> <p>This education resource is aimed at secondary school students and provides them with self contained classroom ready material to learn about the experiences of the Anzacs at Gallipoli. It contains a DVD of the First World War episode of Australians at War along with the documentary Revealing Gallipoli. It also contains a CD with 10 interactive activities.</p>
	<p><b>Investigating Gallipoli</b> – Published March 2010</p> <p>This education resource is aimed at primary school students and provides them with self contained classroom ready material to learn about the experiences of the Anzacs at Gallipoli. It contains a DVD of the First World War episode of Australians at War. It also contains a CD with 10 interactive activities.</p>
	<p><b>Australian Prisoners of War</b> - Published March 2009</p> <p>This education resource provides teachers and students with activities to investigate Australian Prisoners of War using the stories from the <i>Australians at War Film Archive</i>. (AAWFA) The resource provides historical background about Australian prisoners of war since the Boer War and uses the personal stories of veterans and civilian POWs from the Second World War and the Korean War. It contains a DVD documentary using veteran interviews from the AAWFA.</p>
	<p><b>M is for Mates</b> - Published March 2009</p> <p>This colourful picture book is designed for primary students Based on the alphabet it tells the story of the contribution made by animals in wartime and peace operations. It was shortlisted for the 2010 Children's Literature Book of the Year Awards by the Children's Book Council of Australia.</p>
	<p><b>Australian Women in War</b> - Published March 2008</p> <p>This education resource provides teachers and students with self-contained classroom-ready activities and teaching strategies to investigate the roles and experiences of Australian women during more than a century of wars, conflicts and peace operations. Covering women's roles since 1899 to the present it includes the service roles as well as the home front experiences. The resource includes a DVD and a CD with ten interactive classroom activities.</p>
	<p><b>Australia and the Vietnam War</b> - Published 2007</p> <p>Using this education resource, students can learn about the experiences of Australians and the Vietnam War from 1962 to 1973. The resource includes a DVD of the Vietnam episode of Australians at War and a CD with interactive activities.</p>
