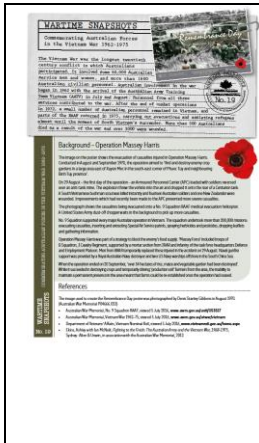

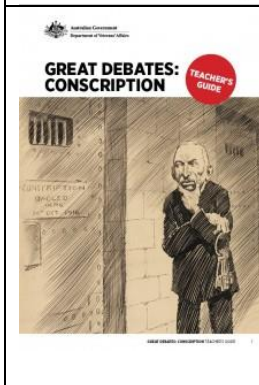
Wartime Snapshot No: 19: Commemorating Australian Forces in the Vietnam War 1962-1975 – Published October 2016

The 2016 Remembrance Day poster features the evacuation of casualties injured in Operation Massey Harris in 1970, during the Vietnam War, which was the longest twentieth century conflict in which Australians participated. It involved some 60, 000 Australian servicemen and women, and more than 1600 Australian civilian personnel. Australian involvement in the war began in 1962 with the arrival of the Australian Army Training Team Vietnam (AATV) in July and August. Personnel from all three services contributed to the war. After the end of combat operations in 1972, a small number of Australian personnel remained in Vietnam, and part of the RAAF returned in 1975, carrying out evacuation and assisting refugees almost until the moment of South Vietnam's surrender. More than 500 Australians died as a result of the war and over 3000 were wounded. This wartime snapshot includes background information and teaching activities to accompany the poster.



Wartime Snapshot No: 18: Centenary of the Somme – Published March 2016

The 2016 Anzac Day posters feature images of Australian soldiers on the Western Front, both behind the lines and on the front line. Following the 1915 Gallipoli campaign, most of the Australian Imperial Force (AIF) served on the Western Front in France and Belgium. There, Australian soldiers and airmen fought in each of the major British campaigns between 1916 and the end of the war in 1918. Of almost 300, 000 Australians to have served on the Western Front, some 46, 000 lost their lives. Such were the conditions in which they fought that more than 18, 000 of those fallen had no known grave. This wartime snapshot includes background information and teaching activities to accompany the poster.



Great Debates: Conscription – Published January 2016

This resource is designed for teachers and students of the Year 9 Australian Curriculum: Humanities and Social Sciences. It enables them to investigate the variety of attitudes Australians had towards conscription a century ago. It is intended to engage students with, as well as educate them about, our political and wartime history through using inquiry-based learning. It adopts a debate format using role-play of key characters. Students are provided with primary and secondary sources to investigate from the perspective of an individual.










Education activities to support *The War that Changed Us* – Published October 2015

These education activities are designed to encourage students to engage with the ABC docu-drama, *The War that Changed Us* (2014) and the rich historical sources it incorporates. The War that Changed Us is an ABC TV series of four 60-minute episodes that explore the lives of six individuals who experienced the First World War from their role on either the battlefields or the home front.



Wartime Snapshot No. 17: The Malayan Emergency and the Indonesian Confrontation – Published October 2015

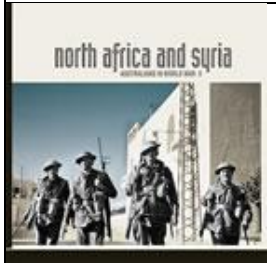
The 2015 Remembrance Day posters feature images of Australian soldiers on patrol during the Malayan Emergency and Indonesian Confrontation. During the 1950s and 1960s, Australian forces were engaged in two conflicts involving Malaya. British Commonwealth forces played a key role in combating a twelve-year long Communist insurgency, known as the Malayan Emergency, between 1948 and 1960. From 1964, Australian served in support of the newly federated state of Malaysia. This second conflict, known as Confrontation, ended in 1966, by which time Australians had engaged in operations in Indonesian territory and on the Malayan peninsula. This wartime snapshot includes background information and teaching activities to accompany the poster.

	<p>Royal Australian Navy (online education resource) – Published July 2015</p> <p>The <i>Royal Australian Navy</i> activities booklet features a selection of inquiry-based activities to encourage student exploration of the commemorative publication <i>Australians in World War I: Royal Australian Navy</i>. Teachers using these materials are encouraged to select specific activities, parts of activities or the broad selection of primary and secondary materials within this learning resource to suit their own purposes.</p>
	<p>Wartime Snapshot No. 16: Centenary of the Gallipoli Landings – Published March 2015</p> <p>The 2015 Anzac Day posters commemorate the landing of Australian and New Zealand troops on the Gallipoli peninsula in 1915. This wartime snapshot includes background information and teaching activities to accompany the poster.</p>
	<p>Wartime Snapshot No. 15: Commemorating the first convoy of Australian Troops to the First World War – Published October 2014</p> <p>The 2014 Remembrance Day poster features an artwork titled <i>First Convoy at Sea</i>, depicting the convoy of ships that sailed from Albany in Western Australia on 1 November 1914 carrying 30,000 men and 8000 horses overseas for service in the First World War. En route, HMAS <i>Sydney</i> destroyed the German raider SMS <i>Emden</i>, ensuring the convoy's safe passage through the Indian Ocean. This wartime snapshot includes background information and teaching activities to accompany the poster.</p>
	<p>Symbols of Commemoration Cube (online education activities for Primary students) Published January 2015</p> <p>This resource is aimed at primary students and contains 17 pages of activities which examine the many symbols of commemoration. The education activities in this resource are aligned to the Australian Curriculum: History and can be used with students in Years 2–6. Teachers are encouraged to adapt the activities to suit their own purposes as each of the six activities is discrete, allowing the selection and use of specific activities or parts of activities. Icons provide a guide to suitability for lower, middle or upper primary students.</p>
	<p>Symbols of Commemoration Cube (online education activities for Secondary students) – Published January 2015</p> <p>This resource is aimed at secondary students and contains 17 pages of activities which examine the many symbols of commemoration. The education activities in this resource are aligned to the Australian Curriculum: History Year 9 Depth Study of World War I. Teachers are encouraged to adapt the activities to suit their own purposes as each of the six activities is discrete, allowing the selection and use of specific activities or parts of activities.</p>
	<p>Wartime Snapshot No. 14: Commemorating the return of Australian forces from Afghanistan – Published March 2014</p> <p>The 2014 Anzac Day poster honours the men and women of the Australian Defence Force (ADF) who are completing their service in Afghanistan, continuing the Anzac spirit and legacy in modern times. This wartime snapshot includes background information and teaching activities to accompany the poster.</p>
	<p>Australian Light Horse: Palestine 1916-1918 (online education resource) – Published October 2013</p> <p><i>The Australian Light Horse – Palestine 1916-1918</i> activities booklet features a selection of inquiry-based activities to encourage student exploration of the commemorative publication <i>Australians in World War I: Australian Light Horse – Palestine 1916-1918</i>. Teachers using these materials are encouraged to select specific activities, parts of activities or the broad selection of primary and secondary materials within this learning resource to suit their own purposes.</p>



Wartime Snapshot No. 13: Commemorating Australian forces in Korea – Published October 2013

The theme of the 2013 Remembrance Day poster is the commemoration of the Armistice of the Korean War in 1953. The image features two members of the 3rd Battalion, The Royal Australian Regiment, carrying a wounded soldier from the Republic of Korea along a snow-covered track towards a medical aid post. Some 18,000 Australians served as part of a multinational United Nations force. More than 330 Australians were killed or lost their lives as a result of their service in Korea. This wartime snapshot includes background information and teaching activities to accompany the poster.



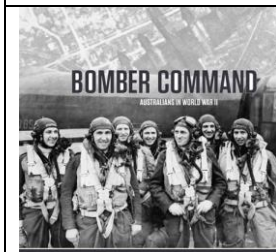
North Africa and Syria (online education resource) – Published June 2013

The *North Africa and Syria Education Activities* booklet features a selection of inquiry-based activities to encourage student exploration of the commemorative publication *Australians in World War II: North Africa and Syria*. Teachers using these materials are encouraged to select specific activities, parts of activities or the broad selection of primary and secondary materials within this learning resource to suit their own purposes.



Wartime Snapshot No 12: Commemorating Australian prisoners of war on the Burma–Thailand Railway – Published March 2013

The 2013 Anzac Day poster commemorates the 70th anniversary of the construction of the Hellfire Pass on the Burma-Thailand railway. The poster depicts Australian prisoners of war labouring on the railway and a train passing over a prisoner-built trestle bridge. Almost 10,000 Australian prisoners of war worked on the construction of the Burma-Thailand railway in appalling physical conditions. Construction of the notorious Hellfire Pass began in April 1943. This wartime snapshot includes background information and teaching activities to accompany the poster.



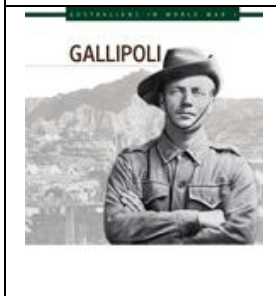
Bomber Command (online education resource) – Published September 2012

The *Bomber Command Education Activities* booklet features a selection of inquiry-based activities to encourage student exploration of the DVA commemorative publication *Australians in World War II: Bomber Command*. Teachers using these materials are encouraged to select specific activities, parts of activities or the broad selection of primary and secondary materials within this learning resource to suit their own purposes.



Wartime Snapshot No. 11: Commemorating Australian forces in the Vietnam War – Published October 2013

The 2012 Remembrance Day poster commemorates Australian forces in the Vietnam War 1962–1975. The poster features an image of Royal Australian Air Force and Australian Army servicemen rushing a wounded soldier from an Iroquois helicopter for treatment at the 8th Field Ambulance in Nui Dat, Vietnam. The casualty is a member of 7th Battalion, The Royal Australian Regiment, wounded in the battle of Suoi Chau Pha on 6 August 1967. This wartime snapshot includes background information and teaching activities to accompany the poster.



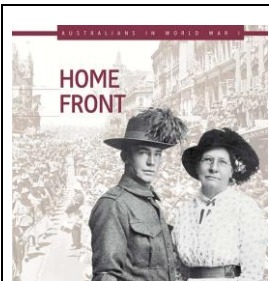
Gallipoli (online education resource) – Published May 2012

The *Gallipoli Education Activities* booklet features a brief introductory activity called 'Getting Started', followed by seven separate activities designed to encourage student interaction with the rich range of historical sources in the *Australians in World War I: Gallipoli* commemorative publication. Some activities utilise the videos and interviews on the *Gallipoli* iBook, which you can download for free on your iPad.



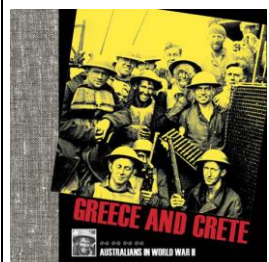
Wartime Snapshot No. 10: 70th anniversary of the Kokoda campaign – Published March 2012

The 2012 Anzac Day poster commemorates the Kokoda campaign and shows native stretcher bearers offering drinking water to Private Baldwin of the 2/33rd Battalion. This wartime snapshot includes background information and teaching activities to accompany the poster.



Home Front (online education resource) – Published March 2012

This resource is aimed at secondary school students and contains over 20 pages of activities. The online materials draw on the rich collection of photos and the brief history provided in the *Australians in World War I: Home Front* commemorative publication, which was printed in early 2012 and is the fifth and final in the series.



Greece and Crete (online education resource) - Published 2011

The *Greece and Crete Educational Activities* booklet complements the *Greece and Crete, Australians in WWII* publication. It contains a range of classroom activities for secondary school students designed to encourage engagement with the text and the rich range of historical sources incorporated in the publication. The resource focuses on five different themes: The Greece and Crete campaign, Leadership, Courage, Retreat and Defeat, and The Legacy of War.



Australian Flying Corps (online education resource) - Published 2011

The *Australian Flying Corps Educational Activities* booklet is aimed towards secondary students. It is designed to complement the *Australian Flying Corps* publication which provides a brief history of the Australian Flying Corps (AFC), in particular their involvement during World War I. The publication includes more than 100 images and photographs that capture that history.
