IMPORTANT UPDATES

MEAO Commemoration

Some sub-Branches are planning for the inaugural Middle East Area of Operations (MEAO) commemoration on Thursday 11 July 2024. An official service, honouring those ADF personnel who served in conflicts in Iraq and Afghanistan during 2001 – 2021, will take place at the Cenotaph in Martin Place, Sydney, at 11am on 11 July. All RSL NSW members, the wider veteran community, and members of the public are invited to attend. More information is available on the RSL NSW website.

The inaugural MEAO commemoration presents a valuable opportunity for sub-Branches to engage with young veterans and current-serving members in their local community, by facilitating a commemoration and taking guidance from younger veterans to modernise aspects of the service.

RSL and Schools Remember ANZAC Art Competition

The RSL and Schools Remember ANZAC Art Competition is now open for 2025. NSW-based primary and secondary schools are invited to submit a maximum of two artworks for judging by a panel consisting of representatives from the NSW Education Standards Authority, Art Gallery of NSW, RSL NSW and the Anzac Memorial Veteran Artist in Residence.

The two winning pieces of artwork will feature on the cover of the 2025 RSL and Schools Remember ANZAC Service program. All finalists will receive a certificate and medal, and will have their artwork displayed at the Anzac Memorial.

This competition closes to schools on 1 November 2024 and finalists will be announced and notified on 15 November 2024. For more information including the guidelines, how to submit artwork, judging and FAQs, please visit the RSL NSW website.



Portal training for sub-Branches and Auxiliaries

- **Sub-Branch Portal:** includes a suite of resources that are specifically designed to assist Office Bearers to successfully operate their sub-Branch, conduct community commemorations, submit budgets, annual returns, and compliance reports, complete training programs, and securely manage member data.

To further assist, a Portal training session is available to all sub-Branches and Auxiliaries. The session can be conducted via Microsoft Teams on a date that suits you and is an opportunity to build your knowledge of both the Member and sub-Branch Portal and to have any questions answered by the team at ANZAC House.

Governor General concludes tenure

On 1 July 2024, His Excellency General the Honourable David Hurley AC DSC (Ret'd) will conclude his tenure as Governor General. For the last 10 years, Their Excellencies General the Honourable David Hurley and Mrs Linda Hurley have been supportive of the Auxiliaries.

Mrs Hurley was Patron of the RSL NSW Auxiliaries during their years in Sydney, and we would like to express thanks for their continued support and wish them much happiness

Ms Samantha Mostyn AO will become Australia's 28th Governor-General when she is sworn in on 1 July 2024.



ANZAC Appeal raised \$36K

A special thank you to the Auxiliaries who assisted ANZAC House with fundraising for the ANZAC Appeal.

A total of \$36,380 was raised from the street-based appeal to help support RSL NSW partner charity, RSL LifeCare Veteran Services.

Veteran Support Fund donations close 30 June

Donations to the Veteran Support Fund (VSF) 2024 initiatives will close on 30 June. Some initiatives have already reached their financial goal, but there are a number of VSF initiatives that are still under-subscribed, including <u>RSL LifeCare Veteran Services</u>.

Contributions to RSL LifeCare Veteran Services are instrumental in ensuring veterans and their families across NSW can continue to access free support and services. Since RSL NSW sub-Branches donated \$3.3 million last year, RSL LifeCare Veteran Services has been able to:

- Provide 305 cases of financial assistance, totalling \$329,365
- Assist 110 veterans with housing and homelessness support
- Provide 3,361 nights of shelter and accommodation to veterans experiencing homelessness
- Help 693 veterans to lodge 3,014 DVA claims
- Lodge 195 new VRB appeals, complete 275 Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) mediation discussions and represent at 29 full VRB Board Hearings
- Facilitate 306 veterans or partners to receive employment assistance or training
- Guide 95 veterans through horse handling and riding courses

As RSL NSW and RSL LifeCare establish more Veterans' & Families' Hubs in NSW, financial support from sub-Branches is critical to ensure that veterans and their families can access local services, including wellbeing support, advocacy, employment and housing assistance, social connection and physical and mental health services.

Donations for the 2025 VSF initiatives will open when they are announced on 1 August 2024.

Congratulations to Ron Irwin, of Wingham RSL sub-Branch, who received the Medal of the Order of Australia (OAM) for his dedicated service to veterans, as part of the Kings Birthday Honours List. Replacement badges

Lost badge replacements should be arranged through your sub-Branch Honorary Secretary and will incur a cost of \$5 per badge + \$12 registered postage and handling. Please note: There is no crown on the new badges, so any member who has stars will not be able to attach them to the new badge.

Damaged badges need to be returned to ANZAC House, as they remain the property of RSL NSW. (Excluding Life Membership Badges, they remain the property of the member.)

Years of service

Stars are no longer issued for 10, 20 or 30 years, however sub-Branches can issue Certificates of Service, if they wish. RSL NSW will issue Certificates of Service for members who have served the League for 50 years and 75 years. Applications should be made by the sub-Branch with supporting evidence.

Life Membership

Life Membership is one of the highest honours that can be bestowed upon an RSL NSW Service Member and therefore all recommendations should be thoroughly considered in that light. This is not a long service award, but an acknowledgment of outstanding service to the League




Penrith RSL Auxiliary
