A report from last year's Lady Woodward Cup winner: Sussex Inlet RSL Auxiliary

First, I must mention the amazing team we have here at Sussex Inlet, and the excitement that was felt when we found out we'd be recipients of the Lady Woodward Cup in 2023!

This was our first time entering, and we certainly didn't think we would be awarded first place. It was a thrill to be recognised after all the hard work we put in.

In August 2022, our Auxiliary was struggling, and we were down to just eight Auxiliary members. Our Coordinator had to step down due to poor health and things looked grim for the Auxiliary's future. So, after much discussion and persuasion, I took on the role of Coordinator and my dear colleague and friend Cheryl Hewitt stepped into the role of Deputy.

Dare I say, I could not do this job without Cheryl!

With the great support of our members, and encouragement from our family and friends, we began to recognise where things could be changed and improved.

Sussex Inlet is a very small community with a large percentage of retirees. Recruiting new members was our first challenge. We needed to get the word out there about what the Auxiliary stands for and its key role within the sub-Branch.

The year leading up to our Lady Woodward Cup nomination was one of hard work, a few mistakes, many successes, and doubt as to whether we could keep going.

In September 2023, the Auxiliary members decided we would give it a crack and let RSL NSW know what we had been up to in our small piece of paradise on the South Coast. What we may lack in numbers, we certainly make up for with enthusiasm.

By the time we were awarded the Cup, we had grown to the Auxiliary to 26 members – including four male members! We have become quite well known around town these days, and with the support of the sub-Branch, our profile in the community is improving greatly.

Our catering for small groups has been an excellent fundraising exercise, as have the monthly BBQs we host at the Sussex Markets, selling bacon and egg rolls and sausages sandwiches. We are assisted by sub-Branch members who help set-up marquees and cook the BBQ. The 7am start on Saturday mornings can be a bit of a challenge, particularly in the winter months, however thinking about why we are doing this gets us through every time!



Commemorations are an opportunity to reflect onthe importance of Australia's military history, and raise the profile of the Auxiliary through fundraising We've made changes to the fundrausing merchandise we have available, and all items sell well.

ANZAC Day is the day for the Gunfire Breakfast, and this year instead of the bacon and egg rolls, we made bacon and egg pies (a staple in New Zealand, particularly on ANZAC Day) and savoury mince on toast. I wrote to our local butcher, grocery store and Farm Greenhouse, asking if there was anything they could contribute. The butcher advised that they would donate 15kg mince, 120 slices of bacon and 15 dozen eggs, while the grocery store donated all the mixed vegetables and 20 loaves of bread, and the Greenhouse donated all the onions. This was an amazing effort from small businesses and a wonderful example of the community spirit in our region.

After cooking all the previous day and arriving at the Hall at 4.30am, we managed to serve breakfast to more than 150 people who all arrived cold and hungry after the Dawn Service. And there was enough food for our Welfare Packs to be delivered to local veterans in need.

Christmas Lunch in July and early December has been another great success. The Auxiliary members prepare, cook and serve a full hot roast dinner with dessert for 60 people with enough left over for welfare packs.

We have also assisted the sub-Branch to host a barefoot bowls day and social BBQs. Our sub-Branch Hall is a hive of activity when these events are held, and it's a wonderful opportunity for camaraderie and social interaction which is so important for members and their families.

When our sub-Branch lawn bowls teams travelled to Dubbo for the Annual Diggers Bowls Competition, 14 Auxiliary members accompanied them. It was a great week and has become a very important part of our annual activities.

We've been lucky to connect with fellow Auxiliaries. Cheryl and I were invited to attend the 75th birthday celebration of the Huskisson Auxiliary and it was a wonderful opportunity to meet other Auxiliary members and the State Auxiliary Coordinator, Pauline James OAM, and thank her personally for her support. The lunch was delicious, and we were made so very welcome. We hope to host the Huskisson Auxiliary at our hall soon!

We also had the opportunity to meet up with a few of the Dubbo Auxiliary members at the Dubbo RSL, where they host the bingo three times a week. We played Bingo and had lunch, and chatted about the different fundraising ideas we have and the difference between the large community in Dubbo and the much smaller one in Sussex Inlet.

Our next event will be the monthly Market BBQ on Saturday 12 October, followed by our Veterans' Health Week lunch on 13 October, so we are very busy preparing for both events.

I'm proud of the work that the Sussex Inlet RSL Auxiliary does and how we fundraise and support our local servicemen and women, veterans and their families, and Auxiliary members. We believe in making everyone feel included and recognising their abilities and the contributions they make to our community, our sub-Branch and our Auxiliary. We want to create a safe and welcoming environment where everyone has a part to play in keeping each other happy and well, both physically and mentally.

Auxiliary member numbers and membership cards



Access online learning

Veterans and their families can now access free online health, wellbeing, and transition programs via the RSL NSW website. Two free self-paced programs, RSL Be:Well and Go Beyond, are now available via the new Online Learning page.

Made for veterans and backed by research, these self-paced programs were developed by RSL Queensland in partnership with Gallipoli Medical Research, to provide veterans with practical information and tools to use during and after their time in Defence.

The RSL Be:Well program is designed to support proactive health and wellbeing, addressing physical, mental and emotional health, as well as social wellbeing, while Go Beyond focuses on key areas of transition, providing actionable guidance that helps veterans to help readjust to civilian life.



Royal Commission into Defence and Veteran Suicide

The Royal Commission into Defence and Veteran Suicide has released its final report, including 122 recommendations to improve services and support for veterans.

- Facilities: Hire for community halls, bowling greens, club facilities, etc.
- Professionals: Fees for a qualified instructor to facilitate an activity
- Safety: Training and purchase of first aid kits, PPE, etc.


St George RSL Auxiliary


Vale Doreen Dromgoole - Sawtell RSL Auxiliary

RECIPE

Apple Charlotte

"Apple Charlotte is a truly delicious dessert! This vintage edition from our archives will still impress, even today." – Pauline James

Ingredients:

- 1 ½ cup plain flour
- 1 cup self-raising flour
- ½ cup custard powder
- ⅓ cup cornflour
- 2 tablespoon icing sugar
- 150 gram butter
- ½ cup water, approximately
- milk

For the filling:

- 6 medium apples
- 2 tablespoon sugar
- ¼ cup water
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice
- ½ teaspoon ground nutmeg

Passionfruit icing:

- 1 cup icing sugar
- ½ teaspoon soft butter
- 1 passionfruit
- 1 teaspoon milk, approximately

- 1. Grease 20cm round sandwich pan. Sift dry ingredients into large bowl, rub in butter. Add enough water to make ingredients cling together. Press dough into ball, knead gently on floured surface until smooth, cover and refrigerate for 30 minutes.
- **2.** Roll two-thirds of the dough on lightly floured surface until large enough to line base and side of prepared pan. Lift pastry into pan, brush edge of pastry with a little milk.
- **3.** To make the filling, peel, quarter, core and thinly slice apples. Combine apples, sugar, water, juice and nutmeg in a pan, bring to the boil and cover and simmer for about 10 minutes, or until apples are tender. Drain the mixture and cool, before spreading into prepare pastry case.
- **4.** Roll remaining pastry until large enough to cover filling, place pastry over filling and press the edges together, trimming neatly. Brush pastry with a little more milk and cut two slits in the pastry.
- **5.** Bake in a moderate oven for about 50 minutes or until lightly browned; cool cake in the pan before turning out.
- **6.** To make the passionfruit icing, sift icing sugar into a small heatproof bowl. Stir in butter, passionfruit pulp and enough milk to make a stiff paste. Stir icing over hot water, until spreadable.
- **7.** Top the cold Charlotte with passionfruit icing and leave to set before cutting.
