Certificate of Merit and Gold Badge

The Certificate of Merit and Gold Badge is the highest award that can be made by the League to a person who is not a Service member. It recognises outstanding honorary service rendered to the League, Ex-Service personnel or their dependants – and at Congress this year, it was awarded to Auxiliary member Diane Traveller.

Her dedication, professionalism, and leadership have contributed significantly to the success of the Balgowlah-Seaforth-Clontarf RSL sub-Branch, and her unwavering commitment to supporting veterans, their families, and the RSL community is exemplary.

Lady Woodward Cup

A total of nine entries were received for the Lady Woodward Cup this year, and the Auxiliaries that entered raised a collective \$175,000.

The Lady Woodward Cup is not awarded to the Auxiliary that raises the most money – as well as fundraising, nominees must demonstrate the ways in which they support veterans and families through diverse activities and engage with the local community. However, this year, a new Certificate of Recognition was introduced for the Auxiliary that raised the largest amount.

The winners of the 2024 Lady Woodward Cup are:

- 1. Old Bar Beach RSL sub-Branch Auxiliary
- 2. Castle Hill & District RSL sub-Branch Auxiliary
- 3. Forestville RSL sub-Branch Auxiliary

And the Auxiliary with the highest fundraising is: East Maitland RSL sub-Branch Auxiliary

Congratulations to everyone who took part! All Auxiliaries are encouraged to enter next year. It is a simple process, with three parts to the nomination form:

- Fundraising for Veteran Services (worth up to 50% of total mark)
- Supporting the local veteran community (worth up to 25% of total mark)
- Engaging with the local community (worth up to 25% of total mark)

It is the RSL Auxiliary that achieves the highest score across all categories that wins the Cup.

Old Bar Beach RSL sub-Branch President Jeff Earley was delighted to present the Lady Woodward Cup Award to Auxiliary Coordinators Vickie Jackson and Jan Crockett. Jeff recognised the Auxiliary as the backbone of the sub-Branch and highlighted the hard work of Auxiliary members, who fundraise, provide wellbeing support, and volunteer for any task asked of them. In response, Vickie expressed her gratitude to the Auxiliary, emphasising the importance of teamwork and the value of every member's contribution.



Old Bar RSL sub-Branch Auxiliary

"The Old Bar Auxiliary is a vital and active part of the Old Bar Beach RSL sub-Branch. We are not separate entities but equal, valued contributors working with the members to support our veterans, their families, and the community. President Jeff Earley calls the Auxiliary the 'back bone' of the Old Bar Beach RSL sub-Branch.

Founded just three years ago by Teresa Earley and Vickie Jackson, the Auxiliary has grown from a small group of 10 members to a thriving team of 39, including 10 male members. Our ages range from 28 to 88, and many of our members are family of service or ex-service men and women, motivated by a strong desire to give back to those who have served. We are a diverse group with a broad range of skills and experiences, from legal and grant writing expertise to organisational talents, singing, and a strong spirit of volunteerism.

We work alongside the RSL members to run weekly and monthly meat raffles, organise stalls and raffles for Anzac and Remembrance Days, and fundraise to promote and support our commemorations. Our Auxiliary is always there to help with preparing and packing up before and after commemorative events, and we take great pride in hosting the Anzac shotgun breakfast, which last year fed over 200 people. We also distribute programs and rosemary to the community during these events and support RSL members with local school and preschool visits, where we educate students about the importance of Anzac and Remembrance Days.

In addition to our fundraising efforts, the Auxiliary is proud to have an active Wellbeing Team, which was formed in September 2023. Starting with 5 members, we've now expanded to 6. Several of our Wellbeing Team members have attended courses run by Lifeline and DVA to better support our members. We make regular phone calls to check on members' wellbeing, offer assistance accessing household support, and visit members in their homes or in hospital.

Our Auxiliary also hosts a bimonthly morning tea, where RSL members can listen to experts talk about services available to veterans. We've had speakers from Manning Audiology, our local Chemist, and a registered nurse. In the New Year, we'll have a psychologist joining us to discuss PTSD programs and services. The positive feedback we've received from members indicates that our wellbeing efforts are making a real difference to their lives.

Additionally, one of our Wellbeing Team members worked closely with our Advocate to create a spreadsheet of clients, tracking their details and progress with claims.

As Coordinator of the Auxiliary, I encourage all members to contribute where and when they can, acknowledging that each of us has unique skills, time constraints, and family commitments. Every little bit helps, and together we are all essential pieces of the Auxiliary puzzle.

Within our sub-Branch, we consider everyone to be family. This sense of unity is at the heart of what makes us such a strong, effective team. We also warmly encourage members to bring along their children or grandchildren to events, helping to pass on the spirit of service and remembrance to the next generation.

The Old Bar Beach RSL sub-Branch Auxiliary is delighted to have won the Lady Woodward Cup because it is a testament to the dedication, hard work, and passion of our members. This recognition reflects the collective efforts of our team in supporting veterans, their families, and the community. We are proud to contribute to the legacy of service and remembrance, and this award inspires us to continue our work with even greater commitment.

Auxiliary Coordinator Role

An Auxiliary Coordinator is a member of an RSL Auxiliary sub-branch who takes on a coordinating role. They act as a liaison between the sub-branch and its members, facilitating communication and collaboration. Responsibilities may include:

Event Coordination:

- Collaborate with the sub-Branch to identify potential fundraising and event opportunities
- Gather input and participation from Auxiliary members
- Coordinate logistics, such as scheduling, volunteer assignments, and resource allocation

Member Engagement:

- Encourage member participation in events and activities
- Address member questions and concerns
- Foster a positive and inclusive environment within the Auxiliary

Communication:

- Maintain regular communication with the RSL sub-Branch and Auxiliary members
- Share event details, updates, announcements, and other important information
- Identify and use effective communication channels (email, phone, social media, etc.)

While the Auxiliary Coordinator plays a vital role in coordinating events and activities, they do not hold a position of authority or decision-making power. Their primary function is to facilitate collaboration and ensure smooth operations within the Auxiliary.

RSL NSW Auxiliaries proudly acknowledged the dedication of four Service Members who volunteer as Cenotaph Attendants.

As a custodian of the Cenotaph in Martin Place, Sydney, RSL NSW appoints Cenotaph Attendants to be present at all approved commemorations and ceremonies held at the memorial. These volunteer Service Members are responsible for preparing the site, assisting guests during wreath laying and ensuring the appropriate flags are flown.

For 78 years, Mr Walter (Wally) Scott-Smith OAM served as a Cenotaph Attendant, becoming Chief Attendant in 1999, a position he held until his retirement on ANZAC Day 2018, aged 96. During his time, Wally recruited four of the current attendants, who were all presented with 'Thank You for Your Service' Quilts at a morning tea at ANZAC House on 9 December.

Vale Bev Oliver - Ingleburn RSL sub-Branch Auxiliary

Mabel (Anita) West OAM

Anita passed away on the 16 October 2024, age 104. She would have been 105 on the 20th December this year.

Anita served in the UK's Women's Auxiliary Air Force (WAAF) from 1939–1946 in signals and as a teleprinter operator attaining the rank of Sergeant. She was also required to complete three years in the WAAF Reserve following the end of the Second World War. She immigrated to Australia after completion of her service in November 1949 and became an Australian citizen.

This remarkable lady gave so much of her life to various veteran services, our Auxiliary the RSL Sub Branch Legacy Widow's Club, Torchbearers for Legacy and the St John Ambulance Association.

Anita was awarded an Order of Australia Medal (OAM) for services to veterans and their families.





Robin McKinnon - North Ryde and Port Macquarie RSL sub-Branch Auxiliaries and Past President CCWA

We have been deeply sadden to hear of Robin's passing. Those who have been around a long time will know that Robin played a huge role in the RSL NSW Auxiliaries – in fact, it was Robin who approached me to be a Councillor. I kept saying no and she kept ringing and wore me down. She told me it would only be for six months, I'm still here 11 years later...

Robin joined North Ryde RSL sub-Branch Auxiliary in 1975, held many roles and dedicated a huge amount of her time. In Central Council, she held the positions of Councillor, State Secretary, State Treasure and then State President until she retired in 2014. Robin was a Life Member and received her Gold Badge and Certificate of Merit for her outstanding service to the RSL Women's Auxiliary at local, State and National level.

On her retirement, Robin relocated to Port Macquarie and became an active member of the Port Macquarie RSL Sub Branch Auxiliary.

Robin passed away 8 October, 2024, her funeral was held 5 November, 2024 at Ungari. Pauline represented RSL NSW Auxiliaries on the day.

Our thoughts are with Shirley Saunders from Canterbury/Hurlstone Park RSL sub-Branch Auxiliary, who slipped while selling poppies for Remembrance Day and broke her pelvis in two places and her shoulder. Love and best wishes for a speedy recovery!
